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1.0 Introduction

IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS VUE 9.4 has two types of release; a Long Term Support (LTS) release and a Continuous Delivery (CD) release. The differences between these two are documented in detail at https://www.ibm.com/docs/SSFKSJ_9.4.0/plan/q004715_.html. This program directory describes installation of the FMIDs associated with the Long Term Support release.

This program directory is intended for system programmers who are responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information about the material and procedures associated with the installation of IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS VUE. This publication refers to IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS VUE as IBM MQ Advanced VUE.

The Program Directory contains the following sections:

Before installing IBM MQ Advanced VUE, read the *CBPDO Memo To Users* and the *CBPDO Memo To Users Extension* that are supplied with this program in softcopy format and this program directory; after which, keep the documents for your reference. Section 3.2, “Preventive Service Planning” on page 5 tells you how to find any updates to the information and procedures in this program directory.

IBM MQ Advanced VUE is supplied in a Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3). The program directory that is provided in softcopy format on the CBPDO is identical to the hardcopy format if one was included with your order. All service and HOLDDATA for IBM MQ Advanced VUE are included on the CBPDO.

Do not use this program directory if you install IBM MQ Advanced VUE with a ServerPac. When you use one of those offerings, use the jobs and documentation supplied with the offering. The offering will point you to specific sections of this program directory as needed.

1.1 IBM MQ Advanced VUE Description

IBM MQ Advanced VUE is a single offering enabling customers to acquire entitlement to IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS and IBM MQ for z/OS Value Unit Edition in a single transaction.

IBM MQ Advanced VUE enables z/OS applications to use message queuing to participate in message-driven processing. With message-driven processing, applications can communicate across different platforms by using the appropriate MQ products. All MQ products implement a common application programming interface whatever platform the applications run on. The calls made by the applications and the messages they exchange are common.

The Managed File Transfer feature of IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS extends IBM MQ for z/OS to allow the transfer of files between systems in a managed and auditable way, regardless of file size or the operating systems used.

The Advanced Message Security feature of IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS extends IBM MQ by enabling messages flowing over IBM MQ to be encrypted so that the message contents remain secure between sending and receiving applications. These applications can be running on z/OS or other supported platforms and the applications do not require changing to make use of the capabilities of the Advanced Message Security feature.

IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS also includes a Connector Pack component containing:

- The IBM Aspera faspio Gateway, which can be used to improve the throughput of message channels over high latency, lossy networks.
- IBM supported, Kafka Connect source and sink connectors for IBM MQ, which can be used to transfer data between IBM MQ and Apache Kafka.

If you are installing IBM MQ Advanced VUE into a new environment it is not necessary to install the Connector Pack component unless you want to use either the faspio Gateway or the Kafka Connectors.

4.0 Program and Service Level Information

4.1 Program Level Information

The Program Directories for IBM MQ for z/OS Value Unit Edition (G113-4489) and IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS (G113-4490) identify the APARs for IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS VUE.

4.2 Service Level Information

No PTFs against this release of IBM MQ Advanced VUE have been incorporated into the product package.

Frequently check the IBM MQ Advanced VUE PSP Bucket for HIPER and SPECIAL attention PTFs against all FMIDs that you must install. You can also receive the latest HOLDDATA, then add the **FIXCAT(IBM.PRODUCTINSTALL-REQUIRESERVICE)** operand on your **APPLY CHECK** command. This will allow you to review the recommended and critical service that should be installed with your FMIDs.

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating IBM MQ Advanced VUE. The following terminology is used:

- *Driving system*: the system on which SMP/E is executed to install the program.

The program might have specific operating system or product level requirements for using processes, such as binder or assembly utilities during the installation.

- *Target system*: the system on which the program is configured and run.

The program might have specific product level requirements, such as needing access to the library of another product for link-edits. These requirements, either mandatory or optional, might directly affect the element during the installation or in its basic or enhanced operation.

In many cases, you can use a system as both a driving system and a target system. However, you can make a separate IPL-able clone of the running system to use as a target system. The clone must include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Use separate driving and target systems in the following situations:

- When you install a new level of a product that is already installed, the new level of the product will replace the old one. By installing the new level onto a separate target system, you can test the new level and keep the old one in production at the same time.
- When you install a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can disrupt the other products. By installing the product onto a separate target system, you can assess these impacts without disrupting your production system.

5.2.2.1 Installation Requisites

Mandatory installation requisites identify products that are required on the system for the successful installation of this product. These products are specified as PREs or REQs.

Conditional installation requisites identify products that are *not* required for successful installation of this product but can resolve such things as certain warning messages at installation time. These products are specified as IF REQs.

5.2.2.2 Operational Requisites

Operational requisites are products that are required and *must* be present on the system or products that are not required but *should* be present on the system for this product to operate all or part of its functions.

Mandatory operational requisites identify products that are required for this product to operate its basic functions.

See the Program Directories for IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS (G113-4490) and IBM MQ for z/OS Value Unit Edition (G113-4489) for details of the individual products' mandatory operational requisites.

Conditional operational requisites identify products that are *not* required for this product to operate its basic functions but are required at run time for this product to operate specific functions. These products are specified as IF REQs.

See the Program Directories for IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS (G113-4490) and IBM MQ for z/OS Value Unit Edition (G113-4489) for details of the individual products' conditional operational requisites.

5.2.2.3 Toleration/Coexistence Requisites

Toleration/coexistence requisites identify products that must be present on sharing systems. These systems can be other systems in a multisystem environment (not necessarily sysplex), a shared DASD environment (such as test and production), or systems that reuse the same DASD environment at different time intervals.

5.2.2.4 Incompatibility (Negative) Requisites

Negative requisites identify products that must *not* be installed on the same system as this product.

5.2.3 DASD Storage Requirements

6.0 Installation Instructions

This chapter describes the installation method and the step-by-step procedures to install and to activate the functions of IBM MQ Advanced VUE.

Please note the following points:

- You can use the sample jobs that are provided to perform part or all of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries that are required for SMP/E execution have been defined in appropriate zones.
- You can use the SMP/E dialogs instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

6.1 Installing IBM MQ Advanced VUE

The installation of IBM MQ Advanced VUE is effected by installing the IBM MQ Advanced for z/OS and IBM MQ for z/OS Value Unit Edition packages included in this offering.

Follow the installation instructions in the relevant Program Directory to install each package. Included Program Directories are listed in Figure 2.
